PRESENTATION:

3. PSTA: BRAD MILLER, CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Brad Miller, Chief Executive Officer, Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority, gave a power point and a brief summary hitting the highlights. Additionally, he mentioned that PSTA was the first public transit system to partner with Uber, provide low income late free transit from ones job to their home from an Uber or taxi, and provide lift for people with disabilities and was currently in a pilot program. He also mentioned some new pilot programs: Flamingo fares (mobile transportation app), smart cards, autonomist buses, and c-pass where PSTA partners with businesses for their employees to ride free.

Mr. Miller thanked Mayor Alahouzos who joined him in Tarpon Springs on the Ride is Golden, which teaches seniors how to use transportation. He would be happy to train residents at Senior Center on this.

The Board thanked Mr. Miller and where excited to see new programs coming on board.

City Attorney Daigneault announced this was a quasi-judicial hearing and explained the process. He then called upon those who would be testifying in this matter and swore in all witnesses. Additionally, the City Attorney asked the Board to disclose any ex parte' communication and there was none.

Heather Urwiller, Planning and Zoning Director, said that this was a request to amend the official zoning map of the City of Tarpon Springs from R-60 (Neighborhood Conservation District) to RM-15 (Residential Multifamily District). She said that written correspondence were received. Additionally, TRC had no objections to the request, the Planning & Zoning Board voted in favor 6 to 1 strictly on the rezoning and not future development at this time, and staff was recommending approval with the following conditions in final form: 1) Structures must comply with most current edition of the Florida Building Codes; 2) Must comply with City of Tarpon Springs Land Development Code; 3) Must comply with FEMA regulations; 4) Sidewalks are required to be installed along Park Street and Grand Boulevard; 5) Site must be connected to sidewalk and ensure ADA accessibility throughout site; 6) Tree survey required and prepared by a licensed Arborist; 7) SWFMD permit is required; and 8) Plans will be reviewed by City's Stormwater consultant.

Board Comments:

There was Board discussion and inquiry on how many units R-60 allowed currently and how many units were allowed if changed. The Board also discussed that at this time, they could only look at rezoning and that a site plan would come back before them prior to the development of that land.

Applicant:

Mike Tagarelli, 601 Laurel Lane, said that he had other rentals and have always been good landlords, screen potential renters, and have no crime in their buildings.

Commissioner Karr inquired as to the future plans of the property and asked the Board to defer if the applicant was willing to bring back a site plan. Mr. Tagarelli said, his goal was just apartments, but did not want to defer this item and bring back a site plan at this time.
