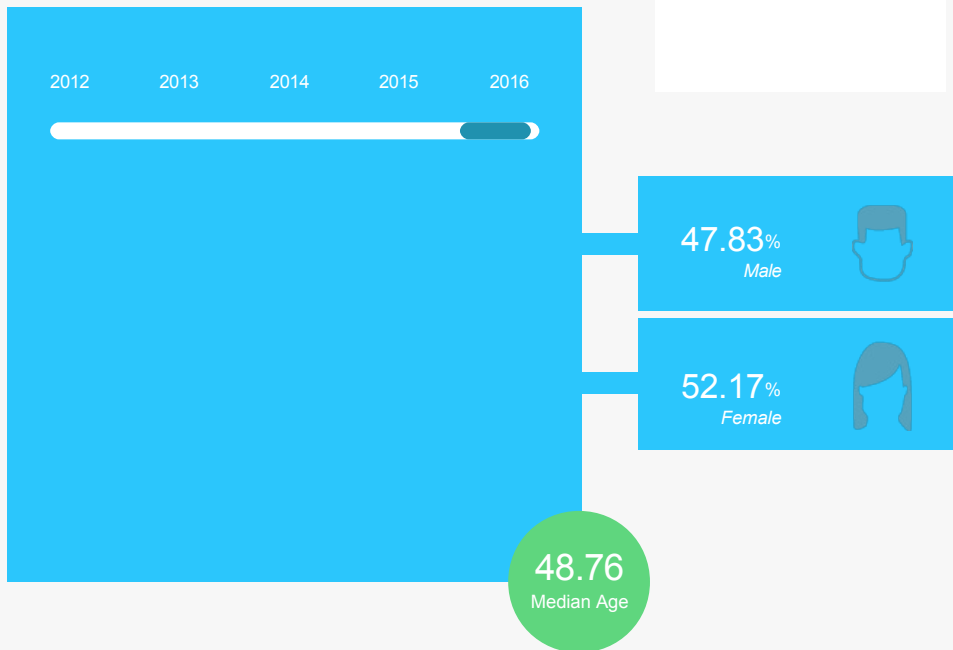

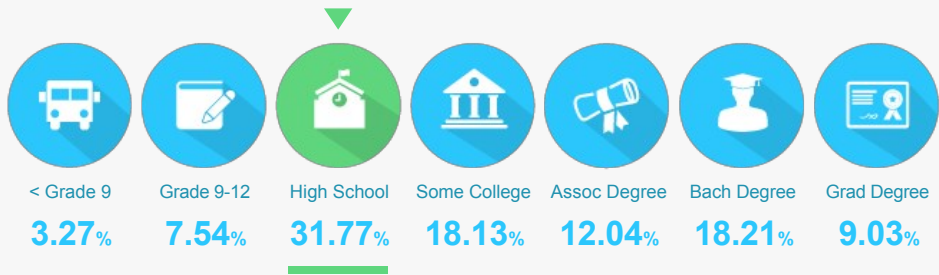

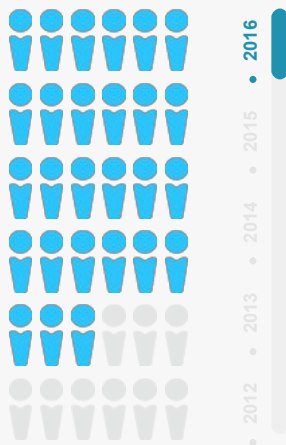

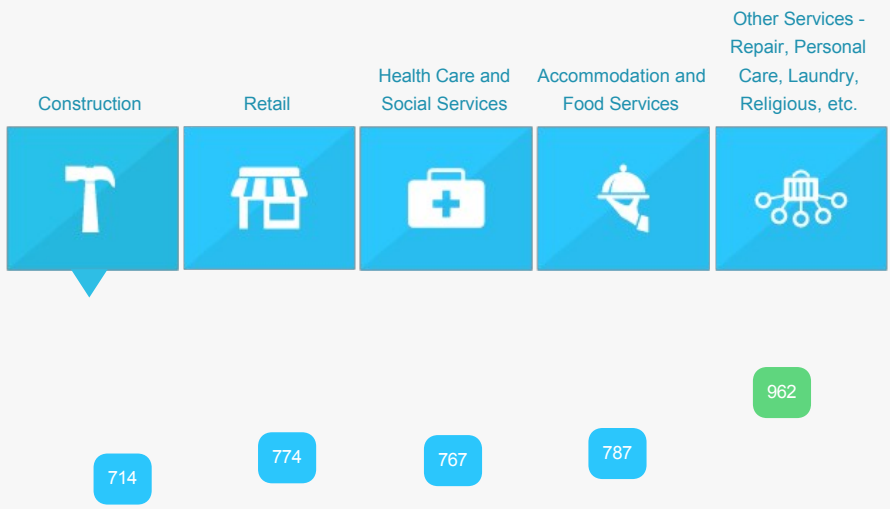

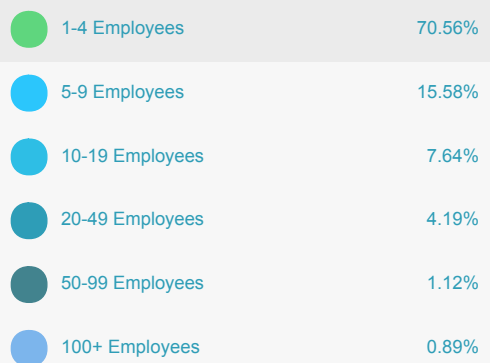

How many employees do businesses in Tarpon Springs have?

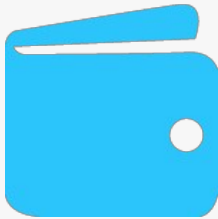

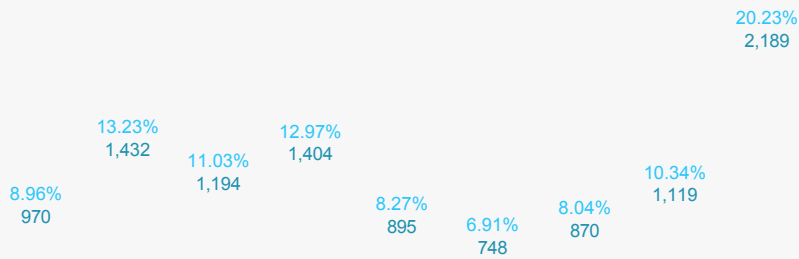

How do people spend much of their money?

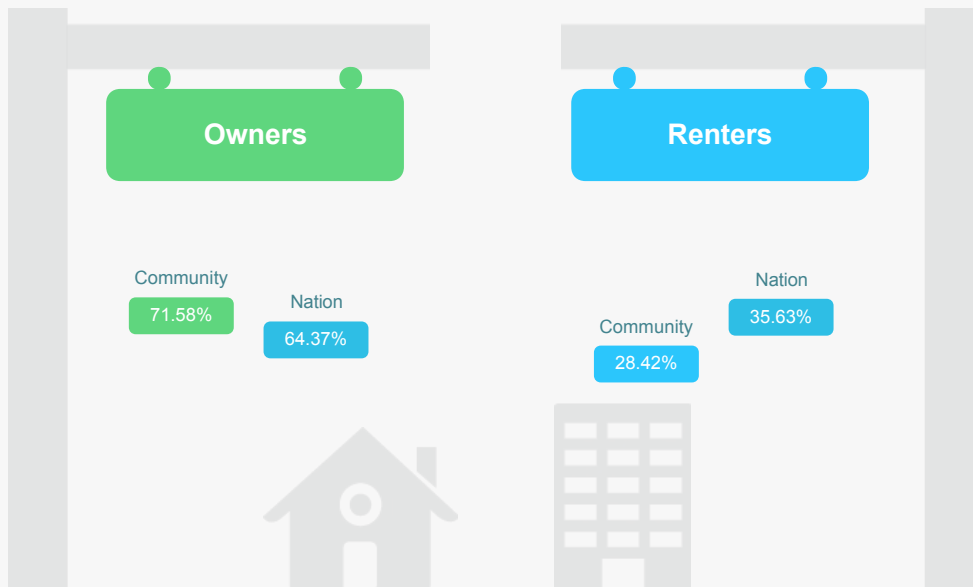

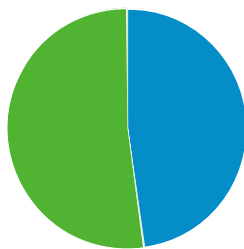

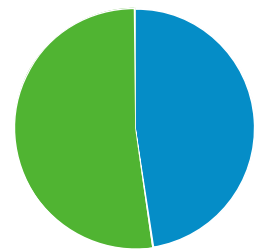

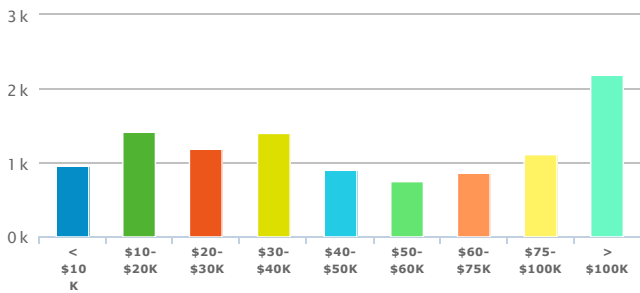

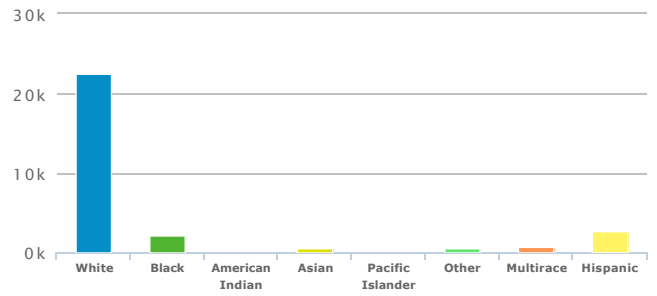

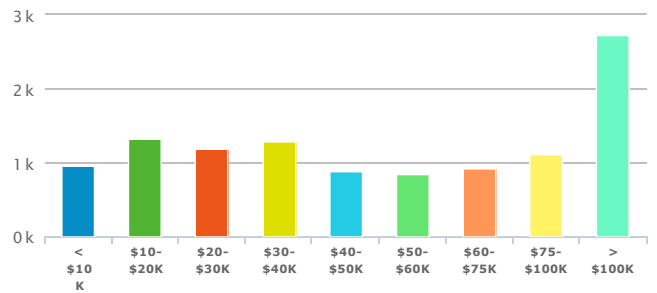

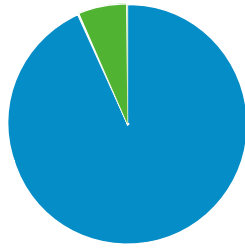

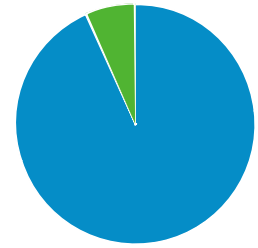

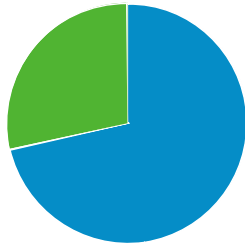

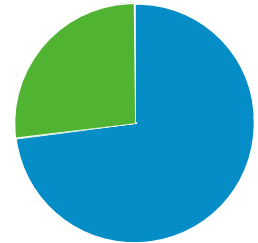

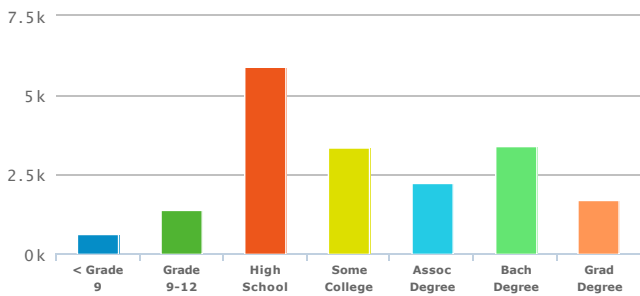

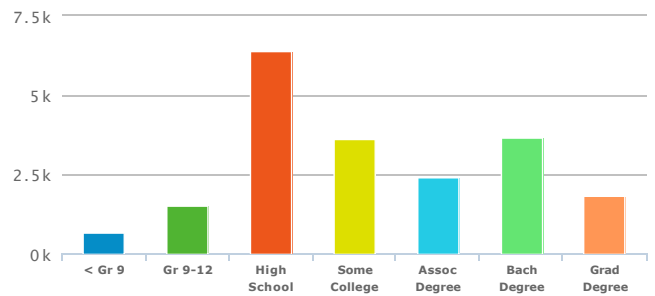

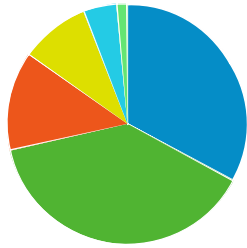

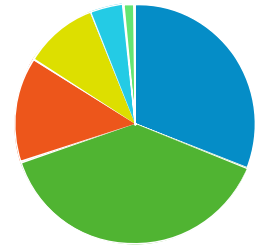
